Journal articles

General form (reference):

Surname, N. N., Surname, N. N., & Surname, N. N. (year). Title. Journal's title, Volume(issue), pages. doi: http://xxxxxxx

- Order the citations of two or more works within the same parenthesis alphabetically. Arrange two or more works by the same author within the same parenthesis by year of publication. Identify works by the same authors with the same publication date by the suffixes a, b, c, etc. after the year.
- Give the periodical title in full, in uppercase and lowercase and italicize it.
- Italicize the volume number but not the issue number.
- If you are citing an article from a print journal, end the reference with a period (.) right after the pages.
- If a DOI is not assigned to the article, but you have retrieved the article online, give the URL of the journal's home page. The retrieval date is not needed. E.g.: Retrieved from http://www.journals.elsevier.com/addictive-behaviors/
- If the article is published in a special issue or a supplement, write this in the place of the issue. E.g.:

¹ If you are citing an editorial, write "editorial" in the place of author's name. If the article has no author, begin the reference with the title.

² If the review has a title, other than the book's under review, write it after the date and before the brackets.

³ For example, when the work is out of print, unavailable through usual sources or written in a language we cannot understand. Generally, it is better to avoid this kind of sources and cite only citations you have studied.

⁴ Cite only the article you have studied.

Book

General form (reference):

Surname, N. N, Surname, N. N. & Surname, N. N. (year). Book title. Place of publication: Publisher.

- Follow the same rules for author's information as for articles.
- When the author and the publisher are the same, use the word "Author" as the name of the publisher.
- Alphabetize books with no author or editor by the first significant word in the title. Use a few words of the title for the in text citation or the whole title if it is short.
- Place information about editions and volume numbers (eg revised edition) in parentheses following the title, with a period after the parenthesis. Eg (Rev. ed.).
- In a reference to a work with no author, move the title to the author position, before the date of publication.
- In a reference to an edited book, place the editor's names in the author position, and enclose the abbreviation Ed. Or Eds. in parentheses after the last editor's name.

 Put a period after the parentheses.
- In a reference to a chapter in an edited book, invert the chapter's authors' names but do not invert book editors' names.
- If no date is available, write n.d. in parentheses. Write in press for articles that have been accepted for publication but have not been published yet.
- Give the exact date of publication for magazines, newsletters, newspapers (e.g. 2017, September 26).
